



JOSEPH F. WEST —joined Sinai Urban Health Institute (SUHI) in 2007 and is currently Senior Epidemiologist/Program Director and Adjunct Assistant Professor Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine.

Previously Dr. West served as the Project Director for the North Lawndale Diabetes Community Action Project (Block by Block North Lawndale), a NIH-funded study. He is the co-Principal Investigator of the Lawndale Diabetes Project, a community-based study aimed at reducing the prevalence of Type 2 diabetes funded by Blue Cross and Blue Shield.

A social epidemiologist, his research interests include diabetes, public health policy and human development. He is the author of the memoir *Trod the Stony Road: A Young Man's Journey from the Mississippi to the Charles*. His work has been featured in Harvard Magazine, the Chicago Tribune and academic journals. He's a frequent guest on numerous radio and television media discussing public health and healthcare topics.

He has received several awards for his community-based work including being named an Eisenhower Scholar, the Albert Schweitzer 'Reverence for Life' award and the Chicago Defender Man of Excellence.
